life everlasting. Amen.**

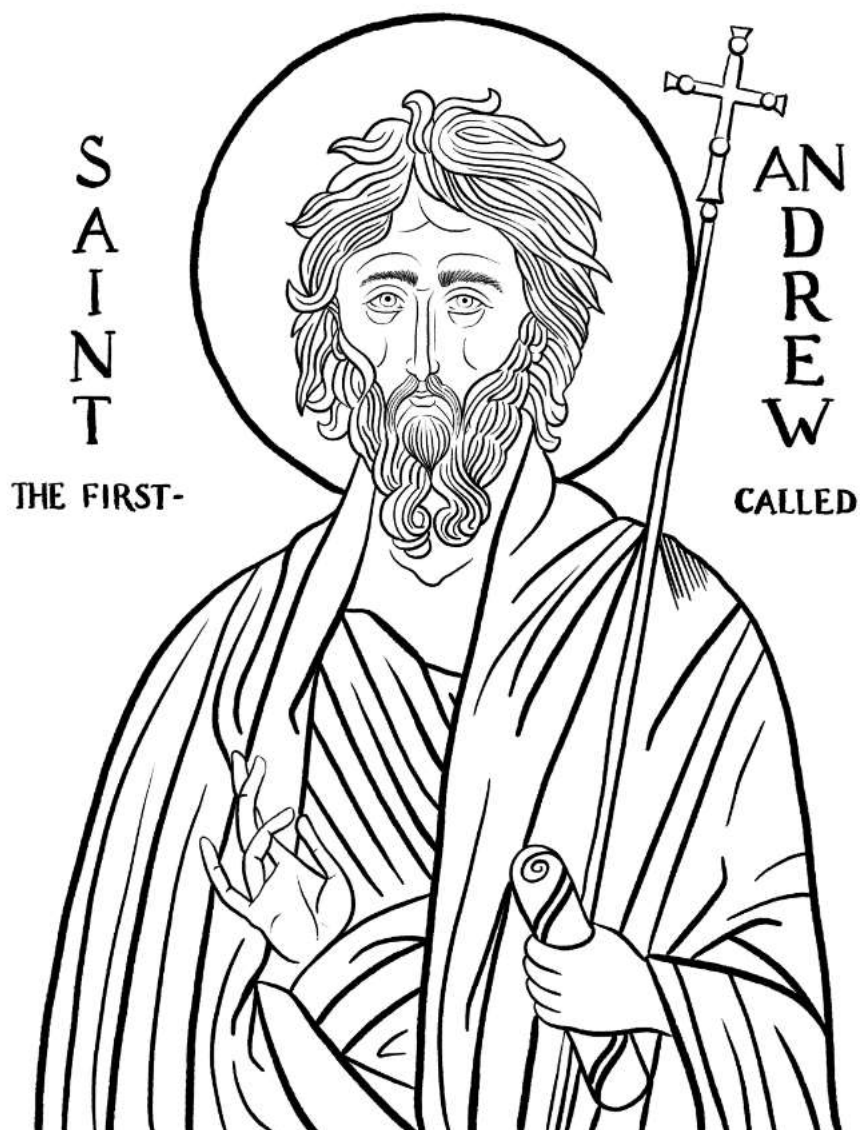
