Leader In our most desperate times, by day or by night, the hope of Christ may be found. We watch and we wait to witness the hope of heaven making a place here on earth.

Leader When we are overwhelmed with conflict without or within, the peace of Christ may be found. We welcome the peace of Christ, present among us and available to all.

Today we light the candle of peace, because peace has come to us.

Light the second candle.

All Welcome, peace of Christ. We breathe in your presence, which sustains us and makes us whole. Where will we find you today?

Confession and Absolution
